



The Higher Certificate in Film, Television and Entertainment Production focuses on basic technical and / or production skills important for the running of a film or television set. The HC programme equips learners with entry level technical and vocational skills for a variety of assistantships in the Creative Industries. It also enables students to enter a degree programme of their choice.

There are 2 streams within the programme. Both streams, or a combination of modules from the two streams, will be offered on a given campus, depending on the student intake and the demand in the selection of a module on that campus.

The programme is designed to equip students with the necessary conceptual, practical and contextual skills to produce multiple forms of film, TV, stage and emerging media content. What defines the programme and sets it apart, is its experiential approach to learning, allowing graduates to thrive in the creative economy of the 21st century.

Students will be guided in how to produce work in a variety of formats for a range of distribution platforms. These include short dramatic narratives, pilot episodes for a drama or comedy series, documentaries, multi-camera actuality or drama shows, social media productions and virtual reality experiences. Distribution platforms include social media platforms, broadcast and streaming services, open access Web 3.0 services, as well as New Technologies' services, platforms or devices.

In Discipline Studies, students will initially gain a broad set of basic conceptual, technical and craft skills in production, screen design, image production, post-production as well as sound and music production. Based on their skills and talents, they will select two disciplines in which they will acquire comprehensive skills. Discipline skills acquisition over the three years of study has been designed to equip students with the required skill sets to meet the ever-evolving production needs of the 21st century motion picture industry.

Higher Certificate in Performing Arts

The 1-year Higher Certificate in Performing Arts is project-led, with a focus on learning through experience. Students are assessed on how they are able to analyse and apply the knowledge they have by performing a prescribed text, as well as running a theatre production including stage props, costumes, sound, lighting and production administration.

This way of learning helps students translate their conceptual understanding into practical skills, as well as socialize their learning through collaboration with their team members. This includes learning Performing Arts techniques, practicum, arts management (hosting and technical management) as well as academic development.



Higher Certificate in Radio & Podcasting

1 Year Full-time | NQF level 5 | SAQA ID 99532 AFDA Johannesburg Campus

The AFDA **Higher Certificate in Radio** and **Podcasting** programme equips learners with entry level technical and vocational skills in the world of radio and podcasting. It also equips students to enter an AFDA degree programme of their choice.

The programme focuses on the basic skills to operate a podcast or radio studio as well as the voice performance skills required for podcast and radio presenting. The programme equips students with the skills to research and

record podcasts and to conduct the logistical and technical running of a radio/podcast production. Students also learn about podcast and radio genres, presentation styles, basic station management, studio equipment and recording devices.

In the 4th term students will either stream a pre-recorded podcast produced by themselves, or assist Live Performance students in the recording of a radio drama.

As is the same in the Motion Picture degree, students in the Live Performance stream follow a project-led, experiential approach to their learning. Students are assessed on how they are able to analyse and apply their knowledge in the context of creating live performance projects for film, TV, stage and emerging media, ensuring that students are prepared to meet the production needs of the 21st century performance industry.

In Discipline Studies, students will have the opportunity to use the knowledge they have gained in Research Studies to experiment, improvise and express their creative voice in the disciplines of stage acting, screen acting and musical performance, as well as a choice of various motion picture disciplines.

Students will gain the skills to successfully position themselves as a performer or presenter for contact environments such as cinemas and theatres, as well as on digital platforms such as social media, broadcast and streaming services, and open access Web 3.0 services.

The **BCom in Business Innovation** at

In their final year of study students will also have the opportunity to operate their entrepreneurial business in a simulated workplace.

The degree focuses on business start-up theories and models that can meaningfully apply to and create tech-based projects. Students are encouraged to conceptualise businesses for the Creative Industries, which may include a collaborative project

with students in the Motion Picture, Live Performance or Creative Writing degrees. An example of this could be a business that utilises immersive experience content, such as Augmented Reality, Mixed Reality and Virtual Reality, as its service.

The tech-focused outcomes allow students to collaborate in a team to realise their start-up business. Each student's role in the business relates to their chosen discipline, and they work together to develop, research and prepare to launch a business start-up to be tested and monetised.



The intent of this qualification is to economically boost the creative economy, by hosting an innovation incubator that develops tangible businesses through a diverse cohort of students. As is standard for Postgraduate level of studies, there is a greater focus on research along with learning outcomes in innovation and entrepreneurship to follow an Undergraduate degree. Our understanding in developing a collaboration-driven Postgraduate Diploma which can be filled with students from Undergraduate degrees of various specialisations and electives, whether in business, entertainment or otherwise, is that diversity enhances innovation. Students will not necessarily learn the foundations of business as an Undergraduate BCom programme may teach, however students

should enter the program with a keen interest in business and entrepreneurship. Students will learn about generating new ideas, researching, innovating and look at applying their previous area of specialisation (discipline) or an area of great interest to them into their role as part of a dynamic and diverse group of individuals. This group will collaborate to develop a business model that harnesses their collaborative disciplines.

The campus facilities will offer these business groups a dynamic office space / innovation lab, cultivating a prime environment for start-ups and entrepreneurial development. This includes access to equipment and new technologies such as VR and AR to leverage business opportunities utilising these or other technological mediums.

*RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

RPL stands for Recognition of Prior Learning. It arises from an international tendency to increase students' access to education by articulating various types and levels of education with each other, to promote lifelong learning and ensuring no-one is barred from higher education. In South Africa, it was a core principle of the White Paper on Higher Education in the late nineties, and again in the January 2012 Green Paper for post-school education and training issued by The Department of Higher Education and Training.

All Higher Education institutions in South Africa must have a policy and procedure to assess prospective students' RPL to see if they can enter the courses with a reasonable chance of success.

AFDA's alternative routes to access degree studies include RPL from other relevant and equal qualifications. To find out if you qualify, send us an email with your enquiry or request an interview.

- RPL: You have 10 years relevant experience in the industry with key responsibilities and roles; and that you pass a formal assessment of the discipline you want to enter.

International Students



If applicants have a recognised international qualification and meet the criteria listed in the Higher Education Act or the AFDA RPL for Access policy (based on the HE Act of 2008). then they may immediately qualify for access into their chosen AFDA qualification.

Alternative access options include via SAQA, or via the AFDA Entrance Exam. Each applicant will be advised individually regarding entry. based on their application with submission of all academic transcript and qualification documents.

A Certified copy of a SAQA Certificate of Evaluation of the applicant's International qualifications is required for acceptance into AFDA programmes. This certificate is obtained from the South African Qualifications Authority - SAQA (www.saga.org.za) The NQF Act, 67 of 2008, gives SAQA the mandate to, "with respect to International qualifications, provide an evaluation and advisory service consistent with this Act".

SAQA fulfils this mandate through the Directorate of International Qualifications Evaluations and Advisory Services (DIQEAS). The work of DIQEAS helps to clarify the meaning of International qualifications for local use and links those qualifications to NOF levels so that the holders of International qualifications can take up work and study opportunities in South Africa.

STEP 1
